



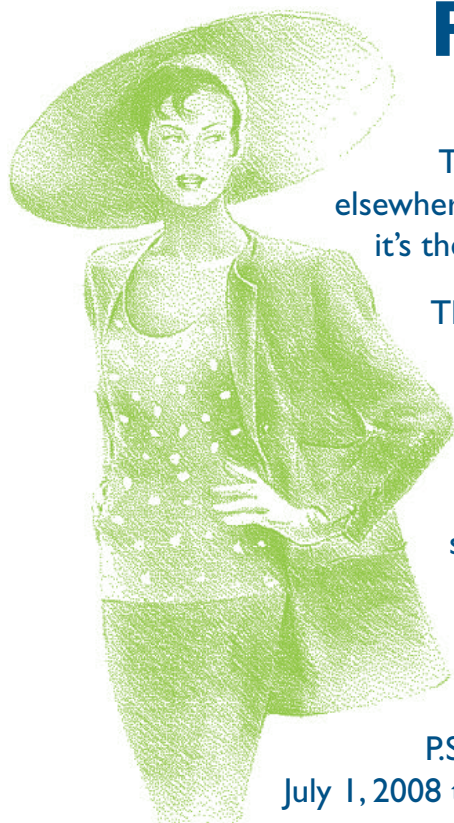

Public AFFAIRS

In early summer of 2008, an all member mailing was sent describing open and closed elections in our state, which is new for Louisiana this year, as well as the dates of the July election and all the fall elections. At the time, these were scheduled for September, October and November. Due to a hurricane, the September election was postponed, and we have since added a runoff election for December 6th.

Because there were so many candidates, propositions and amendments for different months, a Voter's Guide was created on blue heavy stock paper, front and back. Each election date was listed with all to appear on the ballot for each election. In addition, there was information about how to register to vote, and absentee and early voting for each of the elections. This was sent to the entire membership and was distributed across the city at various public libraries, coffee houses, and community centers.

Later, two debates were scheduled on TV, both in front of live audiences.

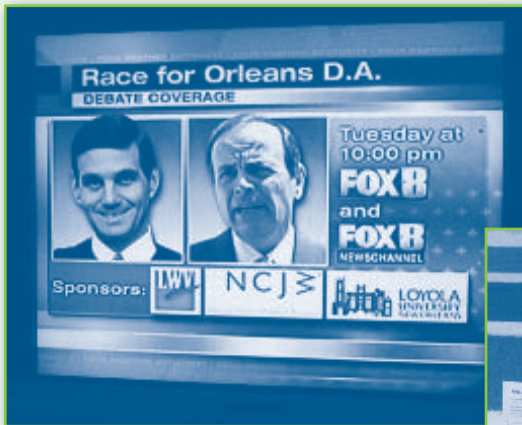
In September, the first senatorial debate between candidates Mary Landrieu and John Kennedy was broadcast live on WDSU-TV6, moderated by Norman Robinson. It was cosponsored by the League of Women Voters (LWV). Sponsoring organizations handed in questions ahead of time. The program was replayed by public stations WWNO Radio, WYES-TV, and several other public stations across the state. C-Span carried it live!

In October, the second debate for District Attorney of Orleans Parish was taped live one night by FOX 8 at Loyola University and broadcast the next night. The moderator was John

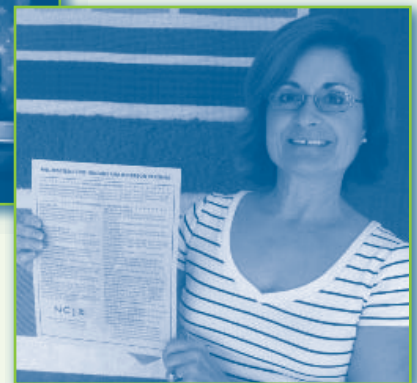
Snell and the debate was again cosponsored by the LWV. Again sponsors turned in questions ahead of time.

On the night of the Presidential election, nine NCJW members went to various precincts to gather totals

on each machine and either call or text message the totals to Channel 6. For each location we made \$50, thereby raising \$450 for NCJW. It took each of us less than an hour. We all thought it was fun, educational, and an easy way to raise money for NCJW.

NEW STUDY GROUP

American Jewish Women Who Changed the World

We are trying a new program this year—a joint study group focusing on “American Jewish Women Who Changed the World.” Each session will be led by one or two volunteers and will utilize materials prepared by Hadassah and/or NCJW, as supplemented by interested group members.

The group will meet once a month on a Sunday afternoon from 3:30 to 5:00 p.m. We are seeking different members to lead and host each meeting. In each meeting, we will discuss and explore the history and impact of one remarkable American Jewish woman.

There is a suggested donation of \$5 per meeting, which will be applied to copying costs and to offset the purchase of refreshments by our host, with any leftover funds donated equally to Hadassah and NCJW. There is no obligation to register for every meeting; members are invited to attend as many sessions as they wish.

This is an opportunity to acquaint ourselves with amazing American Jewish women (including the founders

of our organizations, Henrietta Szold and Hannah Solomon), to draw from their energy and wisdom, and to connect with the women of our community. It is also an opportunity for our members to share their own
